DOCUMENT/ TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

With college 'early action' application deadlines quickly approaching, the file below is a reminder of how to request your documents/transcripts be sent to colleges you applied to.

Requesting Documents to be Sent:

- 1. Move the colleges where you applied to the fourth column in SCOIR (column labeled "Applied")
- 2. Email your counselor and ask her to send your documents.

Requests for Recommendations:

1. Those filling out recommendations for students need at least 10 school days to be able to fulfill requests.

WHAT HAPPENED IN TUESDAY TEA?

<u>Senior TEA</u> - we looked at paying for college and addressed all *leftover* questions and concerns regarding the college application process. There are 2 helpful documents at the end of this newsletter which were passed out to students:

- 1. **Financial Aid Comparison Worksheet** to help you find the college that makes the most sense for your student and your family.
- 2. **Financial Aid Glossary** to help you navigate the unfamiliar terms that will be thrown at you as you receive award letters, acceptances, etc.

<u>Freshman TEA</u> - we introduced the counseling department and the students started to learn about Scoir, our college and career planning website.

BALL STATE INTERIOR DESIGN SUMMER WORKSHOP

For the past thirteen years Ball State's Interior Design program has offered high school workshops/camp experiences where high school students of all levels learn about interior design in a hands-on way. The workshop explores fundamentals of 2D and 3D concepts, basic drawing and illustration skills, use of color and light effects, and how interior environments affect human behavior. This inclusive program seeks to blend tradition and innovation in creative learning.

At the end of the workshop, students have new friends, new perspectives, and a personal portfolio full of ideas!

This year we will be offering four flexible workshops:

- Two ten day on-campus workshops during the summer
- Two three week on-line workshops during the summer

Registration for summer Youth Interior Design Forum is now open.


IMPORTANT FAFSA INFORMATION

You will not see Mercy McAuley listed in the "drop down search" when you get to that point in the FAFSA application. FAFSA adds school names on their own timeline and according to an

indicated need (applicants). NCES updates private schools every 2-3 years and this year Mercy McAuley has not been updated yet.

At one point in the application, you will be asked to enter your high school name. Enter Mercy McAuley High School, then Cincinnati, then Ohio. Instead of "Search" simply click "Next".

FAFSA specialists assured us the drop down search is handled on the government side and will update in the future. Until then, they advised us to enter the school name manually and click next. We are staying in communication with personnel at FAFSA headquarters and are confident that we are taking the proper, proactive approach. As always, we recommend that you complete the FAFSA alongside your parent (as applicable).

JOHN F KENNEDY PROFILE IN COURAGE ESSAY CONTEST

Any student in grades 9-12 are eligible to apply for this scholarship. Deadline for submission is January 14, 2022

Describe and analyze an act of political courage by a U.S. elected official who served during or after **1917**, the year John F. Kennedy was born. Include an analysis of the obstacles, risks, and consequences associated with the act. The essay may concern an issue at the local, state, national, or international level.

RECOGNITION AND AWARDS

- The winner receives a \$10,000 cash award. If the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation
 holds the 2022 Profile in Courage Award event in person, the winner and her/his/their
 family will be invited to travel to Boston to accept her/his/their award in May 2022. Travel
 and lodging expenses will be paid for the trip to Boston for the winning student and
 her/his/their parents.
- Second-place winner receives \$3,000.
- Five finalists receive \$1,000 each.
- Eight semifinalists receive \$100 each.
- Ten students receive honorable mentions.
- The nominating teacher of the first-place winner is also invited to the John F. Kennedy
 Presidential Library to receive the John F. Kennedy Public Service Grant in the amount of
 \$500 for school projects encouraging student leadership and civic engagement. Travel
 and lodging expenses will be paid for the trip to Boston.
- All participants receive a Certificate of Participation.

Winners and finalists will be notified by April 30. All participants will receive a letter announcing the winners and finalists by the end of May.



MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY'S COMMONWEALTH HONORS ACADEMY

June 4, 2022-June 25, 2022

The Academy brings together 120 rising high school seniors from Kentucky and the surrounding region for three weeks for an exciting, challenging academic enrichment program. Upon the completion of the academy, students will

- · Receive 6 hours of honors level university study credit
- Have the opportunity to take an additional six hours of tuition- free university courses at Murray State University during their senior year
- Be awarded a four-year \$2,000 renewable housing scholarship to attend Murray State University

To qualify for the academy, students must have

- A completed Junior year of high school
- A composite ACT of approximately 25 (or equivalent on the SAT) and a 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Other credentials, such as community service, such as community involvement, class rank, and teacher recommendations that are taken into consideration in the selection process

The student application deadline is March 15, 2022
